

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A THREE-YEAR AND A FOUR-YEAR DEGREE?

A three-year degree with a concentration is a recognized credential in Canada. While not aimed at providing students with direct access to graduate level studies, it will prepare you for after degree programs such as our Bachelor of Education and Bachelor of Environmental Health as well as entry-level jobs looking for a university education.

The four-year degree provides students with a comprehensive, flexible education that allows them to develop, understand, and communicate knowledge, to think critically. and to build on these abilities. In addition, the four-year degree fully prepares students for most graduate programs.

Major - The specific area of study you choose to focus on in your 4-year degree. **Minor** – A secondary subject that complements your major or concentration. **Concentration** – A specific area of emphasis within your 3-year degree.



INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE DEGREES EARN AN INTERNATIONAL DEGREE

CHINA

This exceptional four-year program allows students to complete the first year of their **Bachelor of Management degree** at CUE before heading to China for two years to study at the International Business School of Beijing Foreign Studies University (BFSU). After returning to Edmonton to finish the program, students receive two degrees: a Bachelor of Management from CUE and a Bachelor of Economics or Bachelor of Management from BFSU.

FRANCE

This unique three-year program allows students to begin a **Bachelor** of Arts degree in French at CUE, and then complete the final year at Université de Bretagne Sud in Lorient, France. Students earn two degrees upon completion: Bachelor of Arts in French and Licence Lettres Modernes (the French equivalent).

CONNECT HEALTH TO YOUR WORLD.

If this program seems unique, that's because it is. It is **one of only six programs in Canada** that can train you to be an **Environment Health (EH) Officer** or **Public Health Inspector.**

Environmental health is the practice of protecting public health by applying relevant provincial legislation and providing support to mitigate the physical, chemical, and biological risks found in natural and man-made environments. Environmental Health Officers work in diverse settings across the public, private, and not-for-profit sectors, including in educational institutions and research organizations, educational institutions and as consultants. Students in the program who choose to take a 12-week field placement practicum can take the Canadian Institute of Public Health Inspectors (CIPHI) certification exam to be able to practice as a **Public Health Inspector** in Canada.

15- MONTH BACHELOR OF ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

A three- or four-year baccalaureate degree from a recognized university or college.

An admission grade point average (AGPA) of at least 2.3 (on CUE's 4-point scale) or equivalent on the most recently attempted 30 credits. (Normally, courses completed in the spring and summer session immediately preceding the term of entry are not calculated in the AGPA. All grades used in calculating the AGPA are adjusted according to CUE's grade conversion scale.)

Successful completion of:

- 3 credits in chemistry and
- 3 credits in statistics

It is recommended that applicants present:

- 3 credits in microbiology and
- 3 credits in human anatomy or
- 3 credits in human or mammalian physiology

For graduation, students must present these credits.

Note: To register in ENVH561 (Field Experience in Public Health Inspection) students will need to submit an immunization record and a security clearance.

Our program offers unique initiatives to help you in your transition to employment as a teacher, as well as supporting volunteer time in the classroom following the completion of the degree. BRIDGES BURSARY PROGRAM This program is offered to new graduates of the Bachelor of Education After Degree program to fund volunteer time in the classroom following completion of their studies. This creates a transition experience for new-to-the-profession teachers and helps them make connections within the field.






ACCEPTANCE OF AP/IB COURSES
