## PRE-PROFESSIONAL STUDIES AT CMU

## Preparing for a Career in **RECREATION MANAGEMENT AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT**

A year of study at Canadian Mennonite University (CMU) could prepare you to meet the entrance requirements for a baccalaureate program in kinesiology. **This page explains what you must complete if you wish to gain admission at the University of Manitoba to earn the Bachelor of Kinesiology—Recreation Management and Community Development.** If you intend to continue studies at some other university, similar possibilities exist. It is important, however, that you inquire about admission and program requirements at the university you are considering. Work with the Coordinator of Student Advising at CMU to construct a program of studies at CMU that will achieve your objectives.

If you intend to earn your degree at the University of Manitoba, you can begin with a year of studies at CMU and complete the program at the University of Manitoba without adding to the time it would take if you were to go directly to the University of Manitoba.

To become eligible for admission to the Bachelor of Recreation Management and Community Development at the University of Manitoba, you must complete 24 credit hours of university-level courses. You must achieve a minimum GPA of 2.0, but admission is on a competitive basis, so often students need a higher average to compete successfully.

It may be desirable to commute to the University of Manitoba for some courses during the time of pre-professional study at CMU. Courses not available at CMU are highlighted in UPPERCASE LETTERS.

Though any 24 credit hours of university-level courses meet the eligibility requirements for admission to the Bachelor of Kinesiology, to complete the program within three additional years, you should complete as much of the following as possible during your first year at CMU:

- PSYC-1010 Introduction to Psychology I
- PSYC-1020 Introduction to Psychology II
- SOCI-1110 Introduction to Sociology
- MATH-1000 Basic Statistical Analysis
- KPER 1200 PHYSICAL ACTIVITY, HEALTH AND WELLNESS (by letter of permission at the University of Manitoba)
- KPER 1400 CONCEPTS OF RECREATION AND LEISURE (by letter of permission at the University of Manitoba)
